## CA COVID-19 Federal Laws

### Canada's COVID-19 Economic Response Plan (Businesses)

- <u>Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy (CEWS):</u> 75% of an employee's wages (max \$847 per week) for 12 week period (Mar 15-Jun 6, 2020); Employers must have a 30% drop in revenue for April/May (15% for March); apply via CRA's My Business Account portal; benefit amount will be reduced if employer participates in 10% wage subsidy or Work Sharing Program (see below)
  - Norton Rose Fulbright Webinar "<u>CEWS Legislation: What you need to know</u>" this is one of several webinars available from this National law firm outlining government subsidies and considerations for businesses during these uncertain times
- Small Business/<u>Temporary 10% Wage Subsidy</u>: 3 month subsidy to reduce payroll deductions to be remitted to CRA (March 18 – June 19, 2020); no application required (managed by CRA)
- Extending the <u>Work Sharing Program</u>: group of employees (min 2) who agree to reduce their hours
  of work (10-60%) for specific time period (6-26 weeks consecutively); COVID updates eligibility and
  duration extended from 38 to 76 weeks; Submit application via email (Service Canada addresses
  vary with province);10 day processing time
- Business Credit Availability Program (BCAP): access to credit for small business, includes Canada
   Emergency Business Account (CEBA): available to employers with \$50k to \$1M in total payroll for
   2019. Interest free credit if loan repaid by Dec 2022; available through financial institutions
- Deferred payments on income taxes until August 31, 2020, sales tax remittance and customs duty payments until June 30, 2020

#### Hand Sanitizer

- Hard Surface disinfectants and hand sanitizers (COVID-19)
  - o "Health Canada is permitting licensed pharmacists to compound and sell hand sanitizers in their province/territory of practice. Health Canada recommends pharmacists follow a reputable formula, such as the one published by the World Health Organization. Should a pharmacist wish to distribute their product for resale by a third party, they would be required to obtain a valid site and product licence through the process listed above
  - o For "RESALE by third party (i.e. selling to another pharmacy or retail site for resale)"
- <u>Health Canada Advisory</u> temporarily allowing technical grade ethanol to be used in hand sanitizers
